



# April 2018 Post-Conflict Expectations in Marawi City, Lanao del Sur, and Maguindanao

July 18, 2018

SWS April 12-15, 2018 Survey

### Context: The State of the Respondents

- 100 each Lanao del Sur (LdS) & Maguindanao (Mag)
- 50 each from IDP camps & from Marawi residences
- Half of LdS Households, and all of both Marawi groups had IDPs
- Both Marawi groups were net losers in quality of life
- But optimism about coming 12 months rebounded
- Less News Media access than nationwide, almost same level on social media

### Trust & Resilience: Government Entities, Groups, and Individuals

- "Excellent" level of net satisfaction with barangays; ranges from good to excellent with national government (Marawi City residents at this lower end)
- DSWD gets "V.Good to Excellent," TFBM "Moderate to Excellent"
- Marawi respondents turn to family & DSWD in times of calamities or conflict, LdS & Mag to local government
- In land dispute: respected individuals, not institutions
- Trust ratings: Police/Military/NGOs "VG" or "Excellent"

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### Attitudes towards Government Responses in Wake of Marawi Crisis

- Marawi respondents less convinced Duterte has concern for Muslims
- "Good Things done" Mag & LdS cite regular programs, Marawi respondents cite relief operations
- "Bad Things" Mag & LdS "none," Marawi respondents cite destruction/displacement/poor rehab
- Hopeful on Marawi Rehab but less satisfied with pace

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# Political Settlements: Federal System & Bangsamoro Basic Law (BBL)

- Those in IDP camps less convinced of priority of BBL over Federalism
- Marawi City residents more likely to have had campaigners visit
- More campaigners for BBL than for Federalism
- · For BBL: LGUs, Fellow Muslims, MILF campaigned
- · For Federalism: LGUs campaigned
- For ARMM, Maguidanao respondents endorse current system, Maranaos endorse enforcing Shariah
